

The Kucey family has community mindedness in their DNA. "My mom didn't have money to give, but she was always baking things for the neighbours or the church," says Charles Kucey, an Investment Advisor with CIBC.

Charles and his wife, Jane, have shown their generosity over the decades, making gifts to educational, healthcare and cultural institutions — as well as to local causes — through the Kucey Family Foundation and the Kucey Family Foundation for Children.

From creating a university scholarship for promising young golfers through Golf Canada to funding a morale-boosting pandemic coffee program for local hospital workers and supporting a literacy program for the children of new Canadians, the Oakville couple is always finding meaningful ways to make a difference.

And it's the Kuceys' ongoing commitment to community, expressed through years of giving to United Way, that has led to them becoming members of the Million Dollar Roundtable, recognizing their lifetime support of over \$1M.

Jane and Charles have three grown-up children, two of whom live in Canada: their son, Andrew, and daughter, Anastasia, who now help manage the family foundation. Their daughter, Katelyn, now lives in the UK.



Transmitting their values of caring for others was something the Kuceys did throughout their children's formative years. "When they were younger, on Boxing Day, I told them to go to their bedrooms and gather toys for the drive at the church," says Jane. The family would also pack care kits for local women's shelters together.

"Our parents were always really encouraging, even when we were teenagers. Any time Dad was giving, he would always say, 'I'm going to give this much. What does everyone think?" recalls Anastasia. "So, we felt involved from an early age and have tried to continue this."

MARGARET NEWALL
IN MEMORIAM

An Unstoppable Force

As a child, Margaret Newall (1937-2023) witnessed the devastating impacts of the Dust Bowl — massive dust storms that led to hunger and mass migration. Her family, in Davidson, Saskatchewan, often invited people who'd lost everything for supper. Their code was 'family hold back,' meaning guests satisfied their hunger first.

"Seeing other people firsthand who were disempowered and experiencing poverty affected her whole way of seeing," says Margaret's daughter, Alison.

Margaret opposed injustice in all forms and was an unstoppable force in every community she called home.

While teaching in the 1970s, a boy whom she taught was facing violence at home, and the realization that a child wasn't safe in their own home marked her deeply. Later, in the 1990s, she helped found Research and Education for Solutions to Violence and Abuse (RESOLVE) and the Prairieaction Foundation, both committed to research into family violence and identifying community-led solutions. And after reading the full Truth and Reconciliation report,

she rallied support for the Thunder Woman Healing
Lodge — now a recipient of United Way program funding —
so Indigenous women leaving incarceration could heal.

From building neighbourhood libraries to fighting discriminatory rules to sponsoring 2SLGBTQ+ refugees, Margaret made things happen. "She had a T-shirt — which she was very happy with — that said: 'Underestimate me. That'll be fun!'" recalls her eldest son, Ian.

A long-time United Way supporter, Margaret asked important questions and stepped up when needs presented. After attending a Thorncliffe Park Community Hub tour and learning of a \$50K shortfall, she closed the gap — on top of making her generous annual gift to United Way.

Margaret held three honorary degrees and was named to the Order of Canada, but she never sought recognition, just positive change. "She was an optimist," says her youngest son, Malcolm. "She believed a difference could be made."

A Celebration of Life


When Elisabetta Bigsby moved to the GTA, a colleague at RBC proudly referred to Toronto as 'the city that works.' But now, two and a half decades later, Elisabetta sees the challenges facing the city — and she believes engaging the people most affected is the best way to bring about solutions.

Elisabetta was first introduced to United Way through RBC's workplace giving campaign, and she and her husband, Stephen, became long-standing donors. When Stephen passed away, Elisabetta decided to make a onetime gift of over \$800,000 to United Way in honour of her husband.

"We always viewed United Way as the kind of organization that seeks to understand issues through the people involved and to facilitate constructive outcomes through ongoing engagement and cooperation," Elisabetta says.

This gift, an incredible show of generosity and example of trust-based philanthropy, allows United Way to continue investing where they will have the most impact for our region and the people who live here.

"Supporting such efforts seemed the appropriate way to celebrate Stephen's memory. He would have wanted to help."

As a 15-year-old, she lived alone and held three jobs until a high school co-op program introduced her to the world of finance, from which she's built a successful career, now at TD Bank as Managing Director, Head of Securities Lending.

Her non-traditional path underscores how important opportunity can be.

"If you have access to opportunity and drive, you can make it happen," Jenn says. "How can we provide fair access to opportunities, healthcare, housing and food? That's what it's about: everyone can be successful if they just have access."

In her early years, her loving family sometimes struggled with rent or necessities, but she saw the power of community firsthand: a neighbour would show up with a homemade meal, or a food basket would arrive at a critical time. She saw how a small act of kindness makes a huge difference.

Even now, as a busy mom who sits on the board of several non-profits, she continues to make time for issues that resonate with her like women, healthcare, homelessness and underserved youth, particularly in finance.

Her firsthand experience seeing how a support network and encouragement can be transformative motivates her to continue supporting United Way, as does learning about the impact her donations have in community.

"What inspires me to give is these moments, when someone comes in as a recipient of United Way support and shares the impact that support makes and how it helps," she says.

Dominic D'Alessandro knows firsthand what it's like to grow up in poverty and how essential having access to education and opportunities has been to his success.

"I've been poor. I understand that it's not a choice that people make," says Dominic, former President and CEO of Manulife Financial. "Education was everything for me. It was what allowed me to make the most of my life."


